Sedum 'Matrona'	Sedum 'Angelina'
Sedum 'Autumn Joy'	Asclepias tuberosa (butterfly weed)
Panicum 'The Blues' (grasses)	Panicum 'Cloud Nine' (grasses)
Achillea 'Moonshine' (yarrow)	Achillea 'Summerwine' (red yarrow)
Echinacea 'Sunrise' (yellow coneflower)	
Echinacea purpurea (purple coneflower) & 'Kim's Knee-high'	
Heliopsis helianthoides 'Summer Sun' & 'Summer Nights'

The best perennials in my book are the deer resistant and drought tolerant plants! That equals less maintenance for me and this time of the year, I definitely appreciate less maintenance, don't you?!

Here are some mid-summer gardening tips for your perennial beds:

1. Dead-head for longer bloom time or repeat blooming.
2. Water newly planted plants if we do not receive at least a half inch of rain in a week.
3. Weed and mulch to preserve moisture for your plants.
4. Consider setting up a rain barrel or two for watering.
